This award encourages young hydrocephalus researchers to attend the National Conference, meet individuals affected by the condition and their families, interact with leading clinicians and scientists, and improve their understanding of hydrocephalus and the needs of this community.

Eligibility Criteria:

To be eligible, applicants must:

- Be a Young Investigator¹ at the time of application submission.*
- Be actively conducting hydrocephalus research in the United States or Canada.
- Be a member of the Hydrocephalus Association Network for Discovery Science.

1. Young Investigator: Defined as an undergraduate student, graduate student, postdoctoral fellow, medical fellow, or other student who has not completed his/her terminal degree.

2. Regional Travel: Place of residence 150 miles of venue

3. National Travel: Place of residence >150 miles of venue



Applications must be received before **5:00 PM (local time) on Tuesday, November 16, 2021**. Awardees will be contacted in February 2022. For additional information, please contact the National Director of Research at research@hydroassoc.org or 240.483.4540.

All applications must be submitted in English. The award amount is fixed and may not cover all costs associated with traveling and attending the National Conference. The funding will be distributed directly to the award recipient. The award provides no institutional overhead. HA anticipates granting 10 awards. Preference will be given to applicants who have not previously received the award.

Review Process

The technical summary will be reviewed for scientific merit by the HA National Director of Research. All applications that are deemed scientifically sound will be passed to Patient Partner Committee members. The lay summary and letter of support will be reviewed and scored by individuals in the Patient Partner Committee, which is composed of people affected by hydrocephalus (i.e., people with hydrocephalus, caregivers, or family members). Scores will then be combined and averaged. The top scoring applications will be selected until available funding is exhausted.

Technical Summary

The following will be taken into consideration:

- Scientific merit of the project (appropriate design, analysis, conclusions)
- Clear connection to hydrocephalus

Lay Summary

The following will be taken into consideration for scoring:

- Project is clearly described for a lay audience
- Project is interesting/impactful to people affected by hydrocephalus
- Applicant is strongly supported by his/her mentor

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The number of awards will depend on the quality of the applications received, available funds, and the research priorities determined by the Hydrocephalus Association in light of the hydrocephalus research landscape.

- Type applications in black ink using a standard, readable font such as Arial, Helvetica, Palatino, Garamond or Times New Roman with a font size of 11 points or larger. Symbol fonts may be used to insert Greek letters or special characters.

1. Contact Information

Contact information includes the main identifying information for the application including applicant's name and household contact information, institution name, and mentor name and institution. Please use the PDF document provided.

2. Travel and Conference

Please indicate if you are applying for Regional² or National³ travel. Please use the PDF document provided.

3. Technical Summary

This section is the opportunity to describe your project to a scientific audience. Please include the objective, methods, statistical analysis, results, and conclusions. Please use the PDF document provided. Stay within the space provided.

4. Lay Summary

This section is the opportunity to describe your project to the hydrocephalus lay community. Please include the reason(s) why you are doing the project, the short term goal(s) of the project, the methods you are using, the results of the project, and the long-term goals of your research. Please use the PDF document provided. Stay within the space provided.

5. Letter of Support

Please provide a letter of support from a mentor on institutional letterhead. The letter should highlight the applicant's scientific integrity, work ethic, dedication to hydrocephalus research, and potential for a successful research career. Completed applications, including the mentor letter of support, need to be submitted by the deadline. Please do not include more than one letter of support.

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
